The purpose is to bring together international scholars who apply empirical methods to analyse subjective variables as outcomes or determinants in the context of labour market issues. Besides labour economics, research areas of interest may include population economics, migration, HR management, education, health, happiness and public economics. We specifically wish to invite researchers who deal with the potential problems of using subjective measures, as it is our goal to stimulate the debate as well as to enhance research conducted on the basis of subjective data.

The workshop will be hosted by the Institute for Labour Law and Industrial Relations in the European Union (IAAEU) at Trier University **from the 7th to the 8th of October 2016**.
